



King John (1167-1216)

King John of Britain

24 Dec 1167

John, the future King of England is born.

18 Sep 1180

Philip Augustus, Louis VI's grandson, assumes the title of monarch in France. He recaptures most of the western French territory, previously taken by William the Conqueror, from the English King John.

25 Apr 1199

John is crowned Duke of Normandy

27 Apr 1199

John is crowned King of England.

May 1200

John forces Philip to sign a peace treaty

24 Aug 1200

John marries Isabella of Angouleme

22 Nov 1200

William does homage to John

Jun 1201

Philip entertains John in Paris

28 Apr 1202

King John fails to attend a summons to Philip's court

1204

King John of England loses Normandy and the surrounding area to the French king, Philip Augustus.

Jun 1205

John prepares invasion

Dec 1205

John forces election of De Gray

Jun 1206

John defends Aquitaine

26 Oct 1206

Philip and John reach a truce

24 Mar 1208

King John of England opposed Innocent III on his nomination for archbishop of Canterbury.

Aug 1209

John prepares to invade Scotland

Nov 1209

John excommunicated by the Pope

1210

English King John begins imprisoning Jews.

Nov 1212

John, King of England, accepts the Pope's demands.

1212

John extorts money from the barons

Mar 1213

John prepares against invasion

15 May 1213

King John submitted to the Pope, offering to make England and Ireland papal fiefs. Pope Innocent III lifted the interdict of 1208.

Nov 1213

John meets the Barons

1213

English King John names Stephen Langton Archbishop of Canterbury.

2 Feb 1214

John sails for France

27 Jul 1214

At the Battle of Bouvines in France, Philip Augustus of France defeated John of England.

15 Oct 1214

John returns from France.

Jan 1215

John meets the Barons in London

4 Mar 1215

John takes oath for Crusade

1 Apr 1215

Pope sides with John

May 1215

English barons serve ultimatum on King John 'without country'.

17 Jun 1215

English King John signs the Magna Carta at Runnymede in England.

Feb 1216

King John puts down revolt

18 May 1216

A storm hits John's fleet

Jun 1216

King John fights rebels in East Anglia

19 Oct 1216

John, King of England, dies of dysentery at Newark. The Royal Menagerie was begun during the reign of King John.

King John of was succeeded by his nine-year-old son Henry III.

King John attacks Berwick

12 Nov 1216

Revision to the John's Charter (Magna Carta).
